### Program Description

The Language and Literature Department provides valuable language skills and insights into other world views by offering:

COURSES in French leading to a B.A. or B.A.E. degree with emphasis on communication and cultural awareness; EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES such as cultural excursions, opportunities for study abroad, festivals and films, and participation in language clubs.

### Language Placement

Placement is one of the main factors in success in language courses. Students should begin with the highest level language course possible and inquire about CLEP or Credit By Examination for knowledge they bring with them.

110 level language courses are for student with little or no previous experience.

120 level courses are for students with 2 years of high school language experience.

210 level courses are for students with more than 2 years of high school language.

Adjustments to placement will be made in the first week of classes.
