### Program Description

The Human Service Counseling Major is designed to prepare students to work in the helping profession with (a) knowledge of people, individually and in interaction with others, and (b) counseling skills to help people who are making changes in their lives.

The program is built on a strong foundation of psychology and sociology to develop understanding of individuals and the influence of social interaction. Counseling theory and skills enable students to work with people toward functional ways of meeting their needs.

### Special Offerings

In the introductory course, service learning in human service counseling agencies is emphasized.

An agency internship is required near the completion of this program. These experiences provide the student opportunities to gain relevant work experience prior to graduation.

### Scholarships and Financial Aid
