Program Content

Endorsement in Computer Science (15 Hours)

Supplemental endorsement only. This endorsement cannot exist by itself on a certificate, but is added to a certificate only in the presence of other endorsements which may be been acquired earlier or concurrently. Persons with this endorsement may teach information technology courses in grades K-12.

This endorsement requires a minimum of 15 semester hours in Information Technology courses and a minimum of 40 hours of related clinical experiences at elementary and secondary levels.

Courses can be taken by graduate students in any order and by undergraduate education majors in any order as long as it is in the student's junior or senior year.
