Wayne State College offers a one and a half year program of study in Pre-Architecture built around studio arts, mathematics and science, and with a good grounding in communication, the humanities, and the social sciences.

Students may also transfer to other architectural schools. These schools may have different requirements. The advisor will work with the student to meet as many of these requirements as possible at WSC.

Opportunities

Upon completion of the pre-architecture program¹ the student will be academically prepared to transfer to UNL in either architecture or interior design.

Architecture is a combination of art and science. This blending of knowledge is used to shape our physical environment giving expression to societal values and beliefs. The architect is concerned with the form and content of his/her message. The architect is a communicator.

The art of architecture offers a highly varied experience in which each project is unique and challenging. Leading to a satisfying and rewarding profession.

Note: Successful completion of the program includes the student earning a Composite Cumulative Grade Point Average of 2.6.

Program Description

Pre-Architecture provides the student with courses to meet introductory, prerequisite art, science and mathematics training and transfer requirements, as well as the general education needed by the architectural discipline. The program comprises one and one half years of study at WSC that is intended to articulate with the architectural curriculum at the University of Nebraska/Lincoln.

Students intending to transfer to UNL must apply for the 3rd year by early Feb for entry the following Fall. There are no Spring entries at UNL.

Students must meet a visual literacy requirement. This requirement can be met by a minimum of ten semester credit hours in studio arts and/or architectural drafting. However, no more than three credit hours in architectural drafting or architectural design can be included in the combination.

Students may also transfer to other architectural schools such as Iowa State University and Kansas State University.
