Program Description

1. Doctor of Chiropractic at Palmer College of Chiropractic; 1000 Brady Street; Davenport, IA 52803; Northwestern College of Chiropractic; 2501 East Eighty-fourth Street, Minneapolis, MN 55431, or Cleveland Chiropractic College; 6401 Rockhill Rd. Rm. 120; Kansas City, MO 64131-1181.
2. A minimum of 90 semester hours is required for enrollment as of fall 2003 and 30 of those hours must be upper level credit.
3. A minimum grade point average of 2.5 (with no grade below "C") in the pre-professional curriculum is required.
4. Students are strongly encouraged to work toward a B.A. or B.S. degree in an appropriate field. Suggested majors are biology, chemistry, psychology or applied human and sport physiology.
5. Apply to Chiropractic School: Fall Junior or Senior year. Northwestern uses a "rolling" admission policy, where students can enter in September, January or April-May.
6. Northwestern will not accept CLEP credits for science courses. All required science courses must be taken for a grade. No more than 20 semester hours acquired by CLEP or "challenge" will be accepted for transfer.
7. Completion of the pre-professional program does not guarantee acceptance.
