Program Description

The Language and Literature Department offers courses in Spanish, French, and German that help prepare students for graduate study, careers in teaching, and work in many fields where knowledge of a second language is desirable.

Besides courses leading to a B.A. degree, the department offers:

- 1) extracurricular activities such as excursions, language clubs, honor societies, festivals, and films;
- 2) laboratory facilities including satellite television
- 3) an enthusiastic faculty ready to accommodate individual student needs.

NOTE: Students selecting a major will complete the class on the reverse side of this sheet. Students selecting a Spanish teaching endorsement will also need to select a second endorsement and complete all required education classes.

Modern Language Placement

Placement is one of the main factors in success in language courses. Students should begin with the highest level language course possible and inquire about CLEP or Credit By Examination for knowledge they bring with them.

110 level language courses are for students with little or no previous experience.

120 level courses are for students with 2 years of high school language experience.

210 level courses are for students with more than 2 years of high school language.

Adjustments to placement will be made in the first week of classes.
