Wayne State College hosts non-conference foe Missouri-Rolla

THE GAME: Wayne State (4-5 overall) will play their final home game of the 2006 season Saturday afternoon against Missouri-Rolla (5-4). The non-conference contest at Bob Cunningham Field in Wayne will begin at 3:00 p.m.

SERIES HISTORY: This will be the fourth meeting between the two schools in a series that started in 1973. The Miners hold a 2-0-1 advantage over the Wildcats, including a 22-21 win over Wayne State in Rolla last season.

FINAL HOME GAME FOR 14 WSC SENIORS: Saturday's contest will mark the final home game at Cunningham Field for 14 Wildcat seniors. They are: Omari Green, Josh Peterson, Oscar Cervantes, J.R. Rother, Laron Striplin, Zach Molacek, Adam Peterson, Nathan Meyer, Jake Robinson, Andrew Spanjers, Colby Herron, Patrick Parrish, Trent Kling and Sean Tili.

LAST WEEK: For the third straight week, Wayne State was involved in a game decided by three points as the Wildcats fell at home to Concordia-St. Paul 27-24 in the 18th annual Egg Bowl Game. The tightly contested game featured five lead changes as neither team led by more than six points.

Senior Zach Molacek accounted for 247 of the Wildcats 471 yards of total offense as he rushed for 182 yards on 24 carries with one touchdown while adding another 65 yards receiving on four catches to earn Egg Bowl MVP honors for Wayne State. It was the third straight game that Molacek surpassed the 100 yard mark rushing. Freshman quarterback Silas Fluellen completed 19 of 38 passes for 244 yards with two touchdowns. Josh Peterson, Molacek and Logan Masters each had four receptions to lead Wildcat receivers.

Missouri-Rolla won their third game in a row with a 35-20 win over Butler last Saturday to complete a sweep of a three-game homestand. Senior quarterback Joe Winters, who leads NCAA Division II in total offense and passing yards, completed 20 of 34 passes for 271 yards and four touchdowns to lead the Miners in the win. Senior wide receiver Brandon Landry caught four passes for 106 yards and two touchdowns to lead the Miners and was named the Great Lakes Football Conference Offensive Player of the Week for his efforts.

Junior wide receiver Ashton Gronewald finished with 242 all-purpose yards in the game, allowing him to break the UMR single season record in that category. He had a 69-yard punt return and a 10-yard touchdown reception in the win for the Miners.

MOLACEK MILESTONES: Wayne State running back Zach Molacek continues his climb up the Wildcat rushing charts. The senior from Stanton enters Saturday's game with 3,191 career yards, ranking third on the all-time charts at Wayne State. He needs just 78 yards to pass Lamont Rainey (3,268 yards from 1991-94) for second place on the all-time list. Bob Barry holds the all-time school record in rushing with 3,588 yards from 1976-79. For the season, Molacek has 955 yards and needs just 45 yards to reach the 1,000 yard mark for the second time in his career. As a sophomore, Molacek rushed for 1,041 yards. He would join Barry and Rainey as the only backs in school history to rush for 1,000 or more yards in two seasons at Wayne State. Molacek enters Saturday's game as the top rusher in the Northern Sun Conference, averaging 125.7 yards per game in NSIC contests and 106.1 yards per game overall. He also leads the NSIC in scoring (nine touchdowns) and all-purpose yardage at 122.9 yards per game.

ABOUT THE WILDCATS: Wayne State is ranked fourth in the NSIC in total offense at 326.9 yards per game including third in rushing offense (142.7 ypg) and sixth in passing at 184.2 yards per contest. In scoring offense, WSC is seventh with an average of 21.0 points per game.

Defensively, WSC ranks seventh in total defense at 352.2 yards per game. The Wildcats are sixth in pass defense (198.8) and eighth in rush defense at 153.4 yards per game. WSC ranks seventh in scoring defense by allowing 21.9 points per game. Other statistics show the Wildcats tied for second in turnover margin (+9), sixth in kickoff coverage (16.0) and eighth in punting average (32.8).

Individually, senior running back Zach Molacek leads the league in rushing at 106.1 yards per game including a 125.7 average against NSIC opponents. He also ranks first with nine touchdowns and is first in all-purpose yardage (122.9 ypg). Freshman wide receiver Logan Masters is fifth in receiving yards per game (68.4) and touchdowns with seven. Freshman quarterback Silas Fluellen ranks fifth in pass efficiency (116.6), sixth in passing yards per game (154.8) and sixth in total offense (162.8).

Senior safety Adam Peterson is sixth in the NSIC in tackles per game at 9.0 and is tied for second in interceptions with four. Sophomore linebacker Luke Hoffman ranks fourth in tackles per game at 9.2.

MASTERFUL RECEIVER: Freshman wide receiver Logan Masters is enjoying a stellar debut season with the Wildcats. The former Storm Lake (Iowa) High School star leads the Wildcats in receiving with 38 receptions for 616 yards and seven touchdowns. Masters has caught at least two passes in each game and had at least one catch in each game for 20 yards or more in eight straight games until having that streak snapped last week. Masters ranks fifth in the NSIC in receiving yards per game (68.4) and is tied for fourth in scoring with seven TD's.

WSC HEAD COACH DAN MCLAUGHLIN: Dan McLaughlin is in his second season as head coach of the Wildcat program. He led WSC to a 4-7 overall record and a 4-3 NSIC mark last season, marking the first time in school history that Wayne State had a winning record in NSIC play. McLaughlin spent the 2004 season as offensive coordinator at Minnesota State in Mankato, helping the Mavericks go from 0-11 in 2003 to a 6-5 mark in 2004. It was the first winning season at Minnesota State since 1995. McLaughlin was a graduate assistant at Nebraska in 2003 when the Huskers went 10-3 in Frank Solich's last season with the Big Red. Before that, McLaughlin achieved success on the high school field by leading three different schools to state championships. He coached Broken Bow to the 1987 Class B title, guided Norfolk High School to the Class A championship in 1994 and brought Millard West the Class A title in 2001. McLaughlin is believed to be the only coach in Nebraska history to coach three different teams to state championships.

ON THE AIR: All Wayne State College football games during the 2006 season will be carried on KTCH Radio (104.9 FM) in Wayne. Patrick Janssen will be in his second season as the voice of Wildcat football. Pre-game coverage for road games will start 30 minutes before kickoff while home games will feature an extended 60-minute pre game show that includes several interviews at Wildcat tailgate events before the game. Wildcat fans outside of the KTCH listening area can also catch the live broadcast by logging onto the WSC Athletic Department home page at www.wsc.edu/athletics.

2006 CAPTAINS: Wayne State head coach Dan McLaughlin has announced that four players have been elected team captains by members of their team for the 2006 season. They are seniors Omari Green, Zach Molacek, Jake Robinson and Andrew Spanjers.

NEXT UP: Wayne State will close out the 2006 season next weekend at The NSIC Merchants Bank Metrodome Classic in Minneapolis as the Wildcats play #22 Winona State on Saturday with kickoff slated for 3:30 p.m.

ABOUT THE MINERS: Missouri-Rolla brings the nation's top-ranked passing offense in NCAA Division II to Wayne, averaging 359.0 yards per game through the air. The Miners rank 12th in total offense nationally with an average of 418.4 yards per game. UMR is led by senior quarterback Joe Winters, who has thrown for 3,204 yards with 32 touchdowns so far this season. Winters has completed 218 of 391 passes with 11 interceptions and ranks 24th nationally in passing efficiency with a rating of 146.0. His favorite target is junior Ashton Gronewald, who ranks third nationally in receptions (65) and receiving yards with 893 to go with 12 touchdowns. Gronewald is listed 10th nationally in all-purpose yards, averaging 168.2 yards per game.

Brandon Landry, the Offensive Player of the Week in the Great Lakes Valley Conference last week, is averaging 7.3 catches per game with 42 receptions for 650 yards and 11 touchdowns this season while Mike Greaving has 40 receptions for 640 yards and four touchdowns.

Although the Miners are impressive on offense, the UMR defense ranks near the bottom of NCAA Division II, ranking 131st out of 143 schools by allowing 380.7 yards per game. Opponents rush for an average of 211.7 yards per game on UMR while gaining another 169 yards passing against the UMR defense. Senior outside linebacker Avian Jordan (6-3, 250 pounds), leads the Miners on defense with 94 tackles so far this season, which ranks 18th in NCAA Division II.

LAST SEASON'S MATCHUP: Missouri-Rolla raced out to an early 13-0 lead, then WSC rallied for a 21-16 lead before the Miners score late in the third quarter to pick up a 22-21 win over Wayne State. Travis Dietz came in for an injured Sean McLaughlin and completed 7 of 19 passes for 181 yards and one touchdown. Dietz scored on a five-yard touchdown run and threw a 77-yard scoring strike to Marque McCray. The Wildcats took the lead in the third quarter when Laron Striplin rambled 55 yards with an interception for a touchdown to round out the Wayne State scoring. UMR held a 381 to 314 advantage in total offense over Wayne State. Dietz rushed for 56 yards on 11 carries to lead WSC in rushing. UMR quarterback Evan Gray was 30 of 47 passing against WSC for 273 yards with two touchdowns. The top receiver for the Miners was Phil Shin with 13 catches for 122 yards and one score while Brandon Landry added five catches for 55 yards and one score.

MISSOURI-ROLLA HEAD COACH KIRBY CANNON: Kirby Cannon is in his eighth season as the head football coach at Missouri-Rolla after leading the Miners to their most successful season in 20 years during the 2005 campaign. The Miners ended up with a winning record for the first time since 1985 as they recorded a 7-4 record, including wins over two Division I-AA programs. UMR had the fourth-best passing offense in the nation under Cannon last season and set modern day records for points scored with 379 and yards per game with 433.8. Before Missouri-Rolla, Cannon served as an assistant coach at Western Illinois University and Truman State University.

ABOUT MISSOURI-ROLLA, THE SCHOOL: The University of Missouri-Rolla was founded in 1870 and has an enrollment of 5,500 students. Missouri-Rolla is located in south central Missouri near the Ozarks and is one of four campuses that comprise the University of Missouri system. Missouri-Rolla is a member of NCAA Division II and last year joined the Great Lakes Valley Conference in all sports after competing in the Mid America Intercollegiate Athletic Association. UMR has students from 44 states and 63 foreign countries. Missouri-Rolla has produced 17 Division II Academic All-Americans since 2000, tied with North Dakota for fourth most in NCAA Division II.
