Tuition Benefit for Non-Residents Employed in Nebraska

Iowa and South Dakota residents who are employed full-time in Nebraska and pay Nebraska income taxes may qualify for Nebraska resident tuition. An application and further information on this program are available at the Records and Registration Office at Wayne State College (1-800-228-9972). The application and supporting documentation must be submitted at least one week before semester begins. Students who have worked in the state of Nebraska for less than 180 days will pay non-resident tuition rates. Contact the Records and Registration Office for details.

Payment

Student account statements will no longer be mailed. Your account balance is available by logging into WildcatsOnline. A paper statement may be printed from that site.

Tuition & fees are due by Monday, August 27, 2012. Payment may be in the form of personal check made payable to Wayne State College (include campus identification number), money order or charge card (Visa, Master Card or Discover). No cash please. Please contact the Business Services Office 402-375-7224 for information regarding payment plan options.

Students who fail to pay tuition on time may be subject to late fees and a \$100 reinstatement fee should an administrative withdrawal be processed.

Drop Policy

If you decide to withdraw from a class, please inform the Continuing Education Office immediately. If the proper procedure is not followed, refunds and/or grades could be affected. For spring classes that run the full term, there is no adjustment for costs after the first week of class unless the student is withdrawing from school.

Financial Aid

Many of our students qualify for financial aid. For the 2012 fall term, students requesting financial aid must have filed the 2012-13 FAFSA and must have completed the Wayne State

Refund Schedule

ACCESSING ONLINE COURSES

Students should access WSC Sakai courses via Ecampus, WSC's electronic portal.
<http://ecampus.wsc.edu>

Your User Name is the same as your WSC network login -- the first two letters of your first name, the first four letters of your last name, and a two-digit number, usually 01, all lowercase. For example, Jane Smith's login would be jasmit01 (or 02, 03, etc., depending on how many Jane Smith's have network accounts). For new users, the default password is WSC1111MMDDYYYY (where 1111 is the last four digits of Campus ID and MMDDYYYY is your birthday). If you have problems logging in, contact your instructor or the WSC Help Desk at 375-7107 or e-mail helpdesk@wsc.edu.

When you have logged in successfully to Ecampus, go to the WSC Online Resources link. Select Sakai Online Education from the pop-up menu. You should be directed to a Sakai page with a tab for your course(s).

For additional information regarding Sakai, click on the Distance Education link on the E-campus page.

Occasionally, because of security measures at the user end, some users will not be able to access the Sakai site or certain components of the online course. This has happened to some people who were using a workplace computer, for example at an ESU or corporate location. There is little Wayne State can do to address such a problem, except to tell users to contact their system administrators or to work from home or another site. System administrators may need to open ports 8080 and 8443.
