He is Editor of the *Report on Campus Safety and Student Development* and sits on the Board of Trustees of the Council on Law in Higher Education. He has advised hundreds of colleges on best practices for addressing campus sexual assault and alcohol issues and serves as outside counsel to the University of Dayton, Warren Wilson College and the Colorado College.

Mr. Sokolow will provide interactive discussion of the Clery Act, Title IX and Judicial Board training with intensely practical advice that participants can use in their specific roles as administrators, staff or faculty. The first morning session will focus on the Clery Act with the second session addressing Title IX. During lunchtime participants are invited to have lunch from the Cats Corner and engage in a Q and A session with our presenter. The afternoon session will focus on Judicial Board training addressing both a general overview and also more specific emphasis on sexual misconduct. Attendance is not required for the whole day but out of respect to the presenter and other participants if you attend a session please try to arrive at the beginning and if possible stay until it is completed.
