THE REGISTRATION DEADLINE MUST BE MET IN ORDER TO BE ADMITTED FOR TESTING. You **MUST** show your **picture ID to test.** Seating is limited.

The test fees for the CLEP exam are \$85.00. **CASH is not accepted.**

***If you are taking the Freshman College Composition or English Literature exam, an additional fee of **\$10.00** will be due to **Wayne State College** to cover costs of the essay. Once passing results are received on the computer-based portion of the exam, a separate time will be scheduled for the essay to be administered. **The \$10.00 fee will be collected when the essay appointment is scheduled.** Call 402-375-7321 with questions.**

Wayne State College serves as a **military-friendly test center** for CLEP. **Cost:** CLEP exams are free to eligible military personnel. However, military personnel are required to pay a **non-refundable** administration fee of **\$15.00 per test (check or money order made payable to Wayne State College)**, due prior to the scheduled examination date. All eligible candidates **MUST** present a current military identification card and a second form of government-issued photo ID with signature.

2. on the left hand side click on **Exam Descriptions**
3. for Exam Descriptions, click on desired title
4. for individual subject guides (includes sample test) look for **Tools** on the left hand side and then click on **Order Individual Subject Guides**. Type in title of the exam in **Search** box, click on **Add to Cart** (*must have a credit card*).

PLEASE NOTE: The **CLEP Official Study Guide** which has practice tests may also be checked out free of charge from the Circulation Desk in Conn Library.

Candidates must present **two forms of identification**. The primary ID must be a government issued photo ID (driver’s license, passport, military ID with photo and signature, etc.). A secondary ID must contain either a photo or a signature (student ID, Social Security card, employee ID, etc.)**

Do not bring food or drink, books, papers, cell phones, cameras, or any electronic devices.

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
