New students will be assessed a one-time \$15.00 matriculation fee. Students who have been in the state of Nebraska for less than 180 days will pay non-resident tuition rates. Contact the Records and Registration Office for details on residency.

Tuition Benefit for Non-Residents Employed in Nebraska

Iowa and South Dakota residents who are employed full-time in Nebraska and pay Nebraska income taxes may qualify for Nebraska resident tuition. An application and further information on this program are available at the Records and Registration Office at Wayne State College (1-800-228-9972 ext 7239). The application and supporting documentation must be submitted at least one week before semester begins. Students who have worked in the state of Nebraska for less than 180 days will pay non-resident tuition rates.

Payment (Student Financial Services Office)

Students must access account balance information online via WildcatsOnline. Account statements are no longer mailed. Correspondence regarding your student account will be sent to your WSC e-mail account. Be sure to check it regularly. Charges will be based upon current registration information and updated daily. Charges including tuition and all other fees that may be assessed, are due on or before January 28, 2020.

Payment may be in the form of online check available through WildcatsOnline which is free, easy and convenient. Please verify your checking or savings account number and routing transit number and make sure you have sufficient funds before making a payment. Errors will result in a \$30 return payment fee. You can also pay by personal check or money order made payable to Wayne State College and mailed to WSC Student Financial Services, 1111 Main Street, Wayne, NE 68787.

Debit or Credit card payments are no longer accepted in person or over the phone at the Student Financial Services Office. Payment by debit or credit card must be made online through WildcatsOnline. A 2.75% nonrefundable convenience fee will be added to all card payments. This charge is assessed by and paid directly to our payment processor CASHNet SMARTPAY – Higher One, Inc.

Students who fail to pay tuition/fees on time may be subject to late fees and a \$100 reinstatement fee should an administrative withdrawal be processed.

Financial Aid

Many of our students qualify for financial aid. For the 2020 spring term, students requesting financial aid must have filed the 2019-2020 FAFSA and must have completed the Wayne State College Information sheet. Aid packages will not be processed until the student has actually completed registration for spring classes and will be adjusted if hours are dropped or classes never attended. Drop/Withdrawal Policy

If you decide to withdraw from a class, please inform the Distance & Continuing Education Office immediately. If the proper procedure is not followed, refunds and/or grades could be affected. There will be no tuition & fees adjustment for dropping individual courses after the last day to drop/add. Tuition and Fee adjustments for withdrawal from school will be determined by the Student Financial Services office based on the schedule below.

Many states, including Nebraska, require candidates sitting for the CPA exam to have completed a significant number of credit hours in upper-level accounting courses.
