Supplemental endorsement to teach grades 6-12

The Health Sciences education endorsement from Wayne State College will allow you to teach health science topics such as behavioral health, biotechnology research, health infomatics, health sciences, and lifespan performance. The program focuses on helping you learn about the basics of the human body and health care systems. Experience a practicum where you explore the education/training requirements and characteristics of a variety of health care work settings. Working with students in career and technical student organizations such as HOSA-Future Health Professionals will help to develop and build leadership skills to be their future teacher and advisor. Persons with this endorsement will also be eligible for the Work-Based Learning endorsement.

Note: This endorsement requires an applicant to hold, or earn concurrently, a subject or field endorsement in Science, Biology, Health and Physical Education, Physical Education, Health Education, Agriculture Education, or Family and Consumer Sciences Occupational.
