



In the Line of Duty Dependent Education Benefit Tuition Waiver Application

This benefit is established for children of law enforcement officers and firefighters killed in the line of duty. The fatal injury must have occurred on or after April 23, 2009. Those who qualify are entitled to a credit of 100% of tuition and fee charges after subtracting awarded federal financial aid grants and state scholarships and grants. This waiver is available for fall, spring, and summer terms during the applicable academic year.

Any child who is the child of a law enforcement officer or firefighter killed in the line of duty shall be eligible for the education benefit if the child is 25 years of age or younger. The education benefit shall be provided only for full-time undergraduate students who are pursuing studies leading to a degree from a baccalaureate program. The eligible child may receive the education benefit for up to five years if he or she otherwise continues to be eligible for participation. All education benefits received under the In the Line of Duty Dependent Education Act shall cease when the eligible child reaches twenty-six years of age.

Instructions:

Any student requesting the In the Line of Duty Dependent Education tuition waiver must:

- a. Complete and sign this application form.
- b. Provide a copy of their birth certificate or adoption record.
- c. Provide verification of the death of the law enforcement officer or firefighter who was the parent; and
- d. Return this form no later than the start of the term of your enrollment.
