The program allows you to concentrate credits in one primary content area while exploring additional social science electives, supporting both depth and flexibility in your teaching specialization. Coursework emphasizes applied research, instructional innovation, and curriculum design for PK-12 and postsecondary learning environments. This program does not lead to initial teacher licensure, and licensure applicability may vary by state.
