Master of Science in Education (MSE)

Every school needs a leader, and we're here to help you fulfill that role. With an online master's degree in school administration from Wayne State College, you'll be prepared for a career in educational administration. Online graduate coursework prepares you for leadership roles such as principal, assistant principal, or director. Coursework focuses on administration and leadership, school law, finance and facilities, supervision and instruction, and school organization, with optional focus areas in athletic administration or special education supervision. You'll then solidify your skills through a practical internship arranged cooperatively with Wayne State College.

If you already hold a master's degree in education from an accredited institution, you may earn certification by completing an endorsement program that does not lead to an additional degree. Students without a prior master's degree will complete one of the MSE degree options in school administration. Those who have completed a PK-8 or 6-12 school administration degree, you may extend their endorsement to the PK-12 level by completing the appropriate endorsement option.
