Subject endorsement (graduate level)

The Special Education subject endorsement program is designed for graduate students with a current teaching certificate who want to expand their ability to support students with disabilities. This endorsement is intended for those with a current teaching certificate in an area other than Special Education who want to add a Special Education subject endorsement at either the K-8 and/or 6-12 level, as well as those with a current teaching certificate in one level of Special Education who want to add the other subject endorsement level. Coursework emphasizes evidence-based instructional strategies, differentiated teaching methods, and assessment practices that guide high-quality IEP development. Educators also build practical skills in behavior support, collaboration, and co-teaching, while strengthening their understanding of special education law, compliance, and program administration. This endorsement option does not lead to a Master of Science in Education and can include undergraduate coursework as approved by an advisor. The total credit hours vary based on your current level of certification and the level of Special Education subject endorsement desired.

Field experience and clinical practice requirements (6-12 credit hours)

Choose between Practicum Field Experience or Clinical Practice Experience:

1. Practicum Field Experience (6 credit hours) - Practicum Experience allows students to seek endorsement at the same level as their current teaching certification. May substitute a non duplicated special education content course completed at the undergraduate or graduate level for SPD 540 by advisement.

2. Clinical Practice Experience (6-12 credit hours) - Clinical Practice Experience allows students to seek endorsement at a different level than their current teaching certification. If currently certified PK-3 or Middle Level then students must complete SPD 658 for K-8 subject endorsement and/or SPD 660 for 6-12 subject endorsement.
