Supplemental endorsement (graduate level)

The Early Childhood Education supplemental endorsement is a graduate-level, non-degree program designed for educators who want to expand their knowledge and credentials to better serve young learners in grades PK-3. This fully online endorsement strengthens practical classroom skills in early childhood curriculum and teaching methods, child development, assessment, and effective family and community partnerships. Coursework also includes hands-on learning through observation and applied practice in an early childhood setting, helping educators bring research-based strategies directly into their work with children.

This endorsement is intended to support initial teaching licensure/certification in Nebraska. Students seeking licensure/certification in another state should contact the Department of Education in that state for specific licensure requirements.
