## Subject endorsement (graduate level)

Wayne State offers a non-degree graduate-level endorsement as a Reading Specialist (PK-12). This is a supplemental endorsement and requires two years of teaching experience in order to add this endorsement through the Nebraska Department of Education. This endorsement prepares educators to strengthen literacy instruction and improve reading outcomes through research-based teaching strategies, advanced assessment, and targeted interventions for diverse learners. Coursework also develops leadership skills for supporting colleagues through coaching and collaboration, helping schools build stronger, more consistent literacy practices across grade levels. Graduates are prepared to make a meaningful impact by supporting students who struggle with reading and helping all learners build strong, lifelong literacy skills.
